II. Tentative Course Timeline (First Quarter)

Course Overview: English 1000 focuses on analyzing and evaluating literary works within a framework of five modes of literature (Imaginative Comparison, Sound and Syntax, Allusion, Symbol, and Irony). The class will grow student study skills specifically in six genres of literature including the folktale, epic, essay, short story, poetry, and drama. Supporting the evaluation and analysis of literature will be various studies in research, grammar, mechanics, and writing.

Academic Expectations

Homework and Assignment Standards:

Homework will require the following from the student:

- Reinforce learning concepts
- Involve pre-reading and post-reading student participation
- Result in the writing of journals, notes, essays, paragraphs, and papers

Homework will be given daily except on most Wednesday nights and holiday weekends. All homework will be due on Monday at 8:00AM the week after assigned.

No extra credit will be assigned.

An online detention assignment in GoogleMeet will be administered to students who miss 5 homework deadlines.

Partial work will receive a grade no higher than a 50.

Late work will receive 10% penalty each day, maximum of 5 days.

Assignment Formatting:

Typed assignments require an MLA heading format on white typing paper.

A very few written assignments will require blue or black ink on clean lined paper written in cursive.

Most written assignments will be turned in to TurnItIn.com or GoogleClassroom.

Due Date Policies:

All due dates are posted in the GoogleClassroom and remain on the stream for students to see. Students who are absent from an online class are responsible to watch the class video and to complete all missing assignments within a week's time.

Class Participation & Note-Taking:

Students will take notes during class lectures. Sometimes these notes will be collected and graded through the GoogleClassroom. Students are encouraged to keep notes in a notebook to refer back to for future reference and for study toward tests and final exams.

Students will be called on weekly to verbally share answers, thoughts, and opinions in their online class. Their responses will be recorded and charted as part of the effort grade given at the end of each quarter.

Students will participate by offering written answers, thoughts, and opinions in the GoogleClassroom and on Turnltln.com where opportunities will be given for peer commenting and editing to occur.

Materials Maintenance/Other:

Arranged drive-by pickup dates will be scheduled for the student to pick up physical books and supplies needed. Students should check in the GoogleClassroom for dates for drive-by pickups.

Class Procedures

At the start of class:

Students should be PREPARED, having all needed materials ready for class (notebook, paper, pens, all textbooks, homework) at the beginning of the online class. Leaving the computer to collect the above items is considered being unprepared and will reflect on the student's conduct grade.

Students should be PROMPT, having their camera and microphone on with their technology devices up and working at the time of the start of class (Monday-Thursday 10:40 AM).

Students should be PROFESSIONAL, dressed in nice clothing, showing a pleasant background, and seated not walking around at their house.

Students should be FULLY PRESENT, taking notes, contributing answers to questions, and confirming understanding by asking questions or re-stating perceived information.

When you have been absent:

It is the student's responsibility to make up work in the manner outlined in the student handbook. With online classes, homework is due a week later than assigned with an excused absence by Monday at 8:00 AM. Consulting with the teacher because of absences for extended deadlines is encouraged.

Absent students should check RenWeb and the GoogleClassroom to keep up with homework that was missed.

At the end of class:

At the end of the online class, the student should leave promptly and prepare for the next class or finish homework that was assigned for that day.

Addressing the Class:

When called to answer, please be sure your microphone is on and speak so all can hear what you have to say. Keep comments on task and focused on promoting the topic being learned each day.

Turning in assignments:

Homework will be turned in and checked every Monday morning by 8:00 AM from the previous week to GoogleClassroom.

Most written assignments will be turned in to TurnItln.com.

Other:
